This important interaction allowed parents and teachers to discuss each student's academic progress, strengths, and areas requiring improvement. The purpose of the meeting was to understand the child's learning needs and to work collaboratively to support their overall development.

During the session, teachers shared detailed insights into each student's performance, highlighting both achievements and challenges. They also offered guidance on how parents can contribute to reinforcing learning at home. Parents, in turn, had the opportunity to understand their child's progress more clearly and discuss strategies that would help the student improve further.

The meeting strengthened communication between the school and parents, promoting a shared responsibility toward the child's academic growth. Such collaborations play a key role in helping students overcome difficulties and reach their maximum potential.



Your Questions, Answered

1) What is mental health and why is it important?

Put simply - Mental health is about how we think, feel, and manage our day-to-day life. It affects how we learn, work, and build relationships. Just like physical health, we all have mental health and it needs our daily care and attention as it helps us cope with stress, manage life's challenges and live a balanced life.

2) What are some common causes of poor mental health?

There are many factors which can contribute to poor mental health, and these include things like stress from studies, work, societal or family pressure, loneliness, an unhealthy lifestyle (be it around using harmful substances, poor nutrition or lack of sleep), and constant comparison with others also play a role. Additionally, chronic illness, difficult life experiences or feeling unheard for a long time can also add to emotional strain.

3) When you try to explain your feelings to someone but instead of understanding you, they get angry and force you to stay quiet — how should you deal with this situation?

When we try explain our emotions to someone and are invalidated or pushed into silence, it can feel very hurtful when your feelings are not heard. In such moments, it is okay to pause the conversation and give yourself space, but don't let this deter you from speaking up. You can try speaking to someone else you trust who listens calmly and without judgement. Remember, your feelings and experiences are valid, even if someone else is unable to understand them right away.

4) What are some effective ways to communicate with someone who is experiencing some mental health challenges?

If you know someone who might be experiencing challenges with their mental health, the things which can help include – to listen patiently without judging or interrupting them, use kind words and simple questions to show care and concern and to avoid judgement or stigma. It can help to also avoid giving advice immediately - understanding and empathy matter more in those moments. Remember, that sometimes, just being present and allowing them to speak is enough.

5) How can schools and workplaces support mental well-being?

Schools and workplaces can support mental wellbeing by working to create safe spaces where people feel heard and respected while encouraging open conversations and reducing shame and stigma around these conversations and help seeking. Training teachers and leaders to provide first-responder support, and access to help make a big difference in well-being as well.

6) What role do friends and family play in supporting mental health?

Friends and family play a big role as a support systems in someone's mental health as often they are the first people an individual in distress turns to. They can provide comfort, care, and a sense of belonging along with a non-judgemental listening ear or kind words that can reduce stress and loneliness. Their support helps people feel less alone and more confident in seeking help when needed.

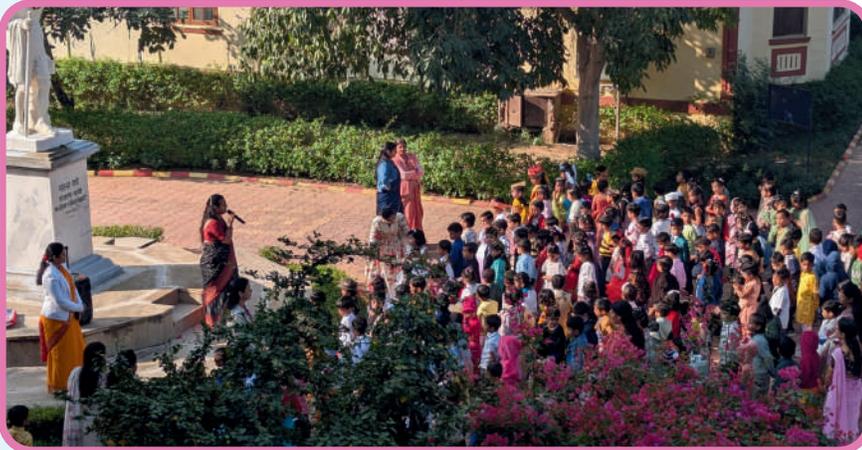
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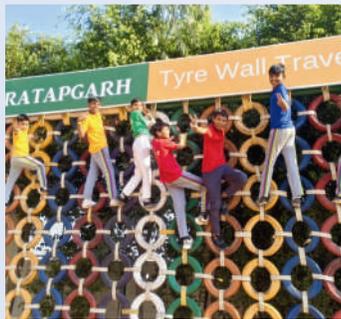
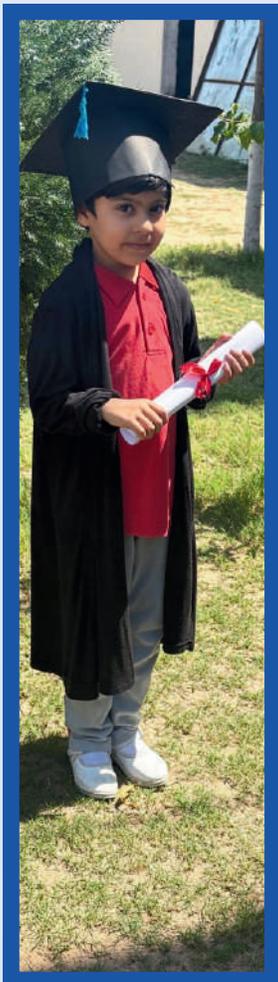

A Journey of Hope and Growth – Podar GPS School, Beri



Dear Readers,

It gives me great joy to share the story of Podar GPS School, Beri — a school that was born in a time of the Pandemic, but grew with determination, love, and teamwork.

Our school came into existence during the COVID-19 pandemic, a time when everything felt unsure. While many were stuck and confused, our management took a bold step to open a new school in Beri village. The Anadilal Podar Trust with a great History of 100 plus years. The management was under the Chairmanship of Rev. Kantikumar A Podar. Under the guidance of the Chairman sir and Executive Director, Shri. MD Shanbag ji, The school was registered in 2020, but we could only open our doors in September 2021, once the government allowed village schools to function, while city schools still remained closed.

We began with just 88 students, and getting even those few admissions was not easy. Our teachers went from house to house, talking to parents and spreading awareness. Out of the eight teachers we started with, five came all the way from Kerala, bringing dedication and new ideas to our classrooms.

Even though our numbers were small, our dreams were big. We never compromised on the quality of education. Every child was treated with care, and we focused on giving them the best start possible. We held assemblies, sports events, cultural days, and an annual function, just like any big school would. Parents' concerns were always heard, and we made sure to provide solutions quickly and kindly.

The following year, in 2022, more families trusted us. We received over 100 new admissions, and our strength grew to 192 students. Financially it was still tough, but the management believed in our vision and supported us fully. Our students made real progress — not just in academics, but in confidence, communication, and values.

Village parents were happy and proud that their children could get good education at an affordable fee, close to home.

Today, in the academic year 2025–26, we are proud to have over 350 students, and our classes go up to Grade VII. In our first year, we had only up to Grade IV, and since then, we've grown steadily, one step at a time.

As the Principal of Podar GPS School, Beri, I truly believe this is just the beginning. With the blessings of the Almighty, the vision of our management, and the passion of our wonderful teachers, we will continue to grow and shine. Our mission is clear — to give every child the education they deserve, in a safe, nurturing, and joyful environment.

Mindfulness, in its basic form, is the act of bringing your complete attention to the present moment, without judgment.

Your senses: Noticing the colors, smells, textures, and tastes of your food.

Your physical and emotional sensations: Recognizing genuine hunger cues, feeling the moment of satiety (fullness), and observing any thoughts or feelings that arise.

Your habits: Becoming aware of when you eat on "autopilot" (e.g., eating while scrolling through your phone) or when you eat in response to emotions rather than true hunger.

Specifically, four key components of mindful eating showed a strong link to better mental health:

1. Awareness: Being fully present and non-judgmentally aware of how food impacts your senses and internal states. This presence promotes psychological functioning.

2. Disinhibition: The ability to regulate your eating by identifying true hunger, recognizing fullness, and acting according to these internal cues. This element of self-regulation is crucial for proactive coping and mental wellness.

3. Emotional Response: Being less likely to eat in reaction to negative emotions (often called "emotional eating"). Our results show that people who don't use food as a primary coping mechanism for feelings are more likely to be mentally well.

4. Distraction: The ability to avoid multitasking while eating. Focusing solely on your meal reinforces the mental practice of remaining in the present moment.

Expert Advice: How to Start Practicing Mindful Eating

Introducing mindful eating is a subtle change, not a drastic overhaul. The goal is to derive more satisfaction out of this ordinary life experience and, in turn, boost your overall mental health.

Here are three simple steps to start eating more mindfully today:

Stop the Multitasking: Commit to at least one meal a day where you put away all distractions—phones, TV, work, and reading materials. Sit down and focus only on the food in front of you.

Engage Your Senses: Before taking a bite, pause. Look at your food. Inhale its aroma. As you chew, focus on the texture and the gradual unfolding of flavor. Try to notice something new about a familiar food.

Check in with Your Body: Before you pick up your fork, ask yourself: "Am I truly hungry, or am I eating because I'm bored, stressed, or following a routine?" During the meal, pause halfway through and ask: "Am I still hungry? Am I starting to feel satisfied?"

These practices help anchor you to the present, replacing mechanical, unhealthy habits with deliberate, satisfying choices. As the study participants noted in their feedback, simply paying attention to your eating habits can bring about profound, positive changes in your daily life.

By focusing on the power of presence in your daily meals, you are not just nourishing your body; you are actively strengthening your foundation for mental well-being.

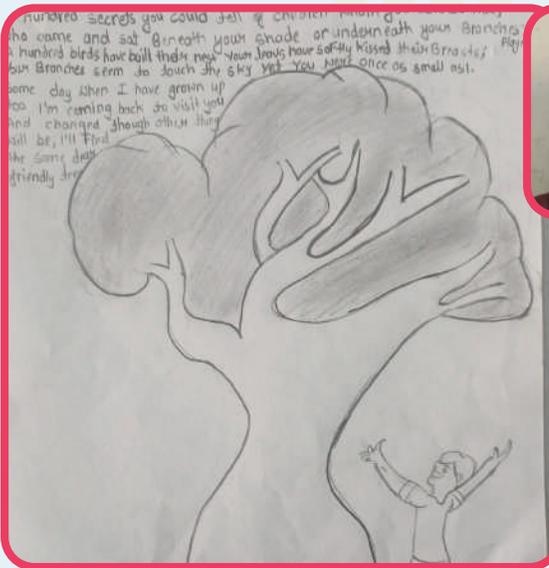
